The department now offers a Master of Arts in Public Relations and a Master of Arts in Electronic Media, a Master of Arts in Film Studies, a Master of Arts in Television Studies, a certificate course in Radio Jockeying and Documentary film Making as well as a PhD in Communication and Journalism.

We have 200 students in a given year in the department.

I am also a PhD research guide in the University and have seven students registered with me doing research in topics as varied as media ethics, newspaper as a pedagogical tool and film theory.

I strategised and implemented PR plans for clients across the country. The company had offices in Mumbai, New Delhi, Bangalore, Chennai, Hyderabad and Calcutta. RCPR was formed after a group broke away from Abacus ICC.

June 2000 to December 2000

Media consultant with Abacus ICC. This is a subsidiary of the Triton Group. I helped in the media relations exercise of the company mainly through preparing dockets and media releases for the company.

November 1999 to April 2000

Deputy General Manager in charge of news at *IN TIME*, the daily news bulletin of IN MUMBAI, a cable TV operation of the Hinduja Group. It was my responsibility to produce two news bulletins, one in Marathi and one in Hindi every day. I had a staff of 48 people from runners to camera attendants, technicians and journalists working with me. I was responsible for the entire

postproduction and news content of the two bulletins. I also anchored the news in both the languages and designed montages for other programmes.

October 1997 to November 1999

Senior metro correspondent, *The Times of India*, Mumbai. My job was to cover all news, which included crime, civic and local affairs, politics, religion, communities and the commodity markets. As one of the two senior correspondents in the newspaper, I also stepped in to take charge of the reporting section when my immediate superior was on assignment or leave.

September 1996

I set up *IndiaMoney* to take charge of India operations of Emerging Markets Data Plc, a Dublin based on line news agency. Emerging Markets had a home page on Bloomberg L.P., U.S. It provided news and features from India, Israel, Turkey and Russia on this site. My job was to ensure that reports from the bourses, specifically the Bombay stock exchange and the National stock exchange reached Dublin twice daily. These were online reports that gave the status of the markets at lunch India time and at close India time. The focus was on indices, prices of the Bombay Stock Exchange's sensitive index and other blue chip shares and quotes from brokers and analysts. I hired stringers to do this job.

May 1995 to August 1996

Senior Correspondent with *Television International*, a 24-hour news and current affairs channel of the Business India group of companies. It was my job to report on the markets across the board for the channel. This included the capital markets, call markets, foreign exchange market and the bullion market. I also covered local news and politics for the channel.

Staff Reporter with *The Times of India*, Mumbai. I covered the crime beat and later the civic affairs beat extensively for the newspaper. I ran a column "Civic Affairs" that appeared every Monday. I covered the Kumbh Mela at Nashik, the earthquake at Latur, the riots and bomb blasts in Mumbai.

My Marathi play *Archimedes* won the first prize in the 1999-2000 All India Playwright's competition for All India Radio. This was a national competition conducted by the All India Radio, the government-owned radio broadcasting company.

Research projects

PUKAR PROJECT

I was research fellow for Partners for Urban Knowledge, Action and Research (PUKAR) in 2005 and conducted an year long research on 'Why Maharashtrians do not make Entrepreneurs'. I guided ten students to explore the reasons why Marathi speaking people in Mumbai did not appear to be inclined to do business and preferred to take regular jobs instead.

The research for PUKAR led to the discovery of a Marathi speaking community, the *Panchal* community, with a population of about 20,000 living in the Mumbai and Thane districts of the western coast of the state of Maharashtra. For two years from 2006 until date, I have been studying this community. In this community if one is not self-employed, then such a person is looked down upon. I have been studying how this community has come to be so different from the other Marathi speaking people. I conducted in depth interviews with about 40 people from this community to understand their history, their motivations and their social attitudes. I have initiated a survey of the community to understand the social and economic status of this community. I presented a paper based on preliminary findings about the communication processes within the community at the Indian Social Science Congress in December 2007.

UGC Major Research

I was co-investigator in a study being conducted by Dr Kiran Thakur and funded by the University Grants Commission. The study titled 'Language of English Newspapers in India' deals with the usage of English language in newspapers.
